	Watchkeeping" limitation is preventing the applicant
	from working in his chosen occupation. His
	psychiatrist's report stated that the applicant should
	remain on medication for the rest of his life in order to
	prevent further recurrence of his illness. Consequently,
	the member determined that remaining on medication
	places him into conflict with the guidelines and
	standards for the issue of MMCs, and withdrawal of
