	(MMC) — The Minister of Transport's position was
	that the applicant's use of a biological modifier,
	Simponi, puts him at increased risk of infections given

	the main issue, from Transport Canada's viewpoint, is
	the medication being used to achieve this stability. In
	their view, this makes him ineligible to hold an
	unrestricted MMC, but fit for an MMC with the
	limitation of "Limited, Contiguous Waters Voyage",
	consistent with accepted international guidelines related
	to medication. The Minister's representative also
	provided evidence supporting the risks associated with
	the use of biological modifiers, and it was established
	that the issuance of a restricted MMC was consistent
