	for an unrestricted medical certificate. The applicant
	had a third bout of kidney stones commencing in March
	2017. He has a more frequent history of recurrence, the
	addition of the gout risk factor, and poor predictability
	of recurrence from his urologist. Even though he found
	that was given only very weak evidence on both sides,
	the member to give more weight to the Minister's
	decision. Fitness to go back to work is different from
	fitness to fly. Renal colic would be disastrous if it
	occurred during one of the critical phases of flight. The
	member expressed that he could not be persuaded that
	at this time it is safe for the applicant to have an
